TITLE: *What is a vote worth? Teaching Women’s Rights through Inquiry and Civic Action*

DESCRIPTION: In this workshop, we will explore how to design inquiry-based lessons and units revolving around women’s rights movements. Historical inquiry values the role of asking and answering questions to develop students’ understandings as they grapple with the enduring issues facing societies across time and space. By focusing on women’s rights movements, and women civic leaders, we’ll explore ways in which inquiry can support inclusive and meaningful history learning. In the second half of the session, we’ll explore how to design opportunities for students to connect women’s history to modern day concerns. By taking informed action, students can civically engage with content in big and small ways. This session will highlight Kentucky women’s history.

TITLE: *How did slavery shape my state? A Kentucky inquiry on the enduring legacy of slavery*

DESCRIPTION: This session will discuss an elementary inquiry, featured on *C3Teachers* and in *The Reckoning* resources, about Kentucky’s slavery history. Though originally designed for, and taught in, a fourth grade classroom, this inquiry can easily be modified for students of all grade levels. Through this inquiry, students explore the slavery system, as well as critically examine how slavery and post-war racial history is woven throughout the state: visible throughout the landscape, cultural artifacts, and state narratives. The session will show how this inquiry bridges slavery history with the 20th/21st century, centering Kentucky.
