As outlined in RFP 540 2100000333, the response thereto by the eight Kentucky educational cooperatives individually and collectively as the Kentucky Association of Education Cooperatives. As outlined in the technical proposal, the Contractor, individually and collectively with KAEC, will implement a tiered system of co-op and teacher learning, teacher piloting, and school/district scaling. By the end of Year 3, self-selected districts, schools, and teachers will begin to embed and sustain these newer methods, providing all students with the cognitively-demanding learning modes needed in today's economic environment.

Memorandum of Agreement Terms and Conditions
Revised December 2019

This Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) is entered into, by and between the Commonwealth of Kentucky, KENTUCKY DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION (“the Commonwealth”) and Kentucky Educational Development Corporation (“the Contractor”) to establish an agreement to provide professional learning modules for educators. The initial MOA is effective from July 5, 2022 through September 30, 2024.

Scope of Services

Contractor will coordinate the delivery of Deeper Learning professional learning opportunities to Kentucky local school districts. Deeper Learning is a broad term to categorize or characterize multiple learning methods—personalized, higher-order thinking, blended, project based, problem-based, inquiry-based, work based, connected learning, experiential learning, competency based, and many more.

As outlined in RFP 540 2100000333 the proposal builds on that improvement partnership, taking the next natural step to the future of K-12: Deeper Learning. As outlined in this Technical Proposal, we will implement a tiered system of co-op and educator learning, educator piloting, and school/district scaling. By the end of Year 3, self-selected districts, schools, and educators will begin to embed and sustain these newer methods, providing all students with the cognitively-demanding learning modes needed in today’s economic environment.

The Deeper Learning Project focuses on classroom and school-level professional learning to increase teacher efficacy and student engagement. The 8 cooperatives will implement a tiered system of co-op and educator learning, educator piloting, and school/district scaling using evidence-based approaches with educational partners approved by KDE. By September 2024, self-selected districts, schools, and educators will begin to embed and sustain these newer methods, providing all students with the cognitively-demanding learning modes needed in today’s economic environment.

Following the planning and membership phase (March 2022-June 2022), The Deeper Learning Initiative (DLI) will be implemented across Kentucky in three phases.

*Phase 3 extends beyond the end of the grant period (September 30, 2024)

Phase 1: Learning (July 2022 – December 2022)

Deeper Learning is a broad, perhaps imprecise term to categorize or characterize multiple learning methods—personalized, higher order thinking, blended, project based, problem based, inquiry based, work based, connected learning, experiential learning, competency based, and many more. Many of our districts do not have the bandwidth to do the meaningful types of review to uncover methods that best fit their own students.

In Phase 1, we will provide time for guided and collegial learning around evidence-based Deeper Learning methods. By July 2022, DLI Teams will be selected and will attend a statewide Deeper Learning Conference. Learning will focus on KAEC Deeper Learning Pillars, and additional, vetted vendors/methods that meet KDE’s evidence-based requirements will be secured. The format will allow for district choice and ensure quality requirements are met.

For example, KAEC has already vetted nine potential vendors and received their evidence for best-practice requirements by asking the University of Kentucky’s Center for Next Generation Leadership and bravED to submit appropriate documents so that we have a system for this process as we pursue our vendor choices. UK’s Next Gen 9 provides nine core ideas that prioritize the work of deeper learning, while bravED’s True Accountability™ shifts the mindset and practice to focus accountability on student benefits. In fall 2022, DLI Teams will again gather for further learning and to determine the school/district pilots for the project (Phase 2).

Phase 2: Piloting (January 2023 – June 2024)

We anticipate that our participating districts will be ready to pilot their deeper learning plans with their new vendor partners and/or collaborate with cooperative deeper learning teams in small doses (classroom or grade level, school level) beginning in the Spring semester of 2023. Many of our districts will continue learning with an eye toward piloting in fall 2023. Our staff will work with districts and partners to help create networking and group learning environments that keep costs down while also providing collegiality for educators and leaders. To put it succinctly, we anticipate staff will spend more time with districts as they pilot and scale.

Phase 3: Scaling (July 2024 – June 2025*)

By July 2024, we anticipate our districts will begin to scale from their initial pilot project to establish Deeper Learning initiatives school and/or district-wide. Vendor partners and our staff will continue to support the professional learning in each region, including individualized coaching and collegial networking. Our goal is to maintain the services of the DLI Statewide Director for the entire 2024-2025 school year using funds from KAEC because we are aware that the funding expires on September 30th, 2024.

Goals/Deliverables

The project will be led by a Statewide Deeper Learning Director (Director), a current Kentucky School District Superintendent transitioning to this work July 2022. The Director will be responsible for interaction with KDE on behalf of the Contractor individually and collectively as KAEC. The eight educational cooperatives will have one of the cooperatives serve as the hiring entity for the Director. Funds to support goals/deliverables and salary of the Director will be included in the budget for the hiring cooperative.

Reporting

Contract reporting requirements:

- 1) The grantee, through the Statewide Deeper Learning Director, shall submit professional learning plans for each Phase of the grant. The description should tie to the Cooperative’s submitted budget and should include the overall goals of the Cooperative’s professional learning plan, how the Cooperative’s professional development plan aligns to the overall goals of the grant. In addition, the description should provide a schedule for all professional learning opportunities with descriptions and dates and expected number of participants. The statewide report should include summary reports on the professional learning plans of each cooperative. These plans are due on the following schedule:

2) The grantee, through the Statewide Deeper Learning Director submit written narrative reports about the progress of the grant on the following schedule:

These statewide reports will include information on the all aspects of the grant including reporting on the professional and collegial learning activities, budget reports, highlights of good news and other key information.

3) In addition, the Statewide Deeper Learning Director will present an update to the KAEC on at least a quarterly basis, beginning in January 2023.

4) At the beginning with Phase 2 of the grant period, each cooperative will submit an initial baseline data that will provide, by participating district. (see attachment 2)

*Contractor acknowledges that KDE must comply with reporting as required by the U.S. Department of Education and Contractor hereby warrants that it will provide all necessary data and information required for said reporting. Additional information will be provided upon release of the reporting requirements.

Pricing: Contractor budget is based on a formula that allows for differences among the cooperatives in terms of number of special education districts and enrollment. A majority of the contract amount is designed to go to school districts for stipends and other costs associated with the grant. The expectation is that districts will spend at least 67% of their total allotment on educator stipends.

The remaining amount of the contract will be used by the cooperative for grant expenses. From this amount, the cooperative will set aside funds for Opportunities for Extended Learning (OEL's).

Discrimination

FERPA, NSLA and CNA and will enter into a confidentiality agreement and ensure its employees and contractors execute affidavits of nondisclosure as required by KDE.

Data Security and Breach Protocols

Contractors that receive Personal Information as defined by and in accordance with Kentucky’s Personal Information Security and Breach Investigation Procedures and Practices Act, KRS 61.931, et seq., (the “Act”), shall secure and protect the Personal Information by, without limitation, complying with all requirements applicable to non-affiliated third parties set forth in the Act.

“Personal Information” is defined in accordance with KRS 61.931(6) as “an individual’s first name or first initial and last name; personal mark; or unique biometric or genetic print or image, in combination with one (1) or more of the following data elements:

An account, credit card number, or debit card number that, in combination with any required security code, access code or password, would permit access to an account;

A Social Security number;

A taxpayer identification number that incorporates a Social Security number;

A driver’s license number, state identification card number or other individual identification number issued by an agency;

A passport number or other identification number issued by the United States government; or

Individually Identifiable Information as defined in 45 C.F.R. sec. 160.013 (of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act), except for education records covered by the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act, as amended 20 U.S.C. sec 1232g.”

As provided in KRS 61.931(5), a “non-affiliated third party” means “any person or entity that has a contract or agreement with the Commonwealth and receives (accesses, collects or maintains) personal information from the Commonwealth pursuant to the contract or agreement.”

The contractor hereby agrees to cooperate with the Commonwealth in complying with the response, mitigation, correction, investigation, and notification requirements of the Act.

The contractor shall notify as soon as possible, but not to exceed seventy-two (72) hours, the contracting agency, the Commissioner of the Kentucky State Police, the Auditor of Public Accounts, and the Commonwealth Office of Technology of a determination of or knowledge of a breach, unless the exception set forth in KRS 61.932(2)(b)2 applies and the contractor abides by the requirements set forth in that exception. The contractor hereby agrees to report, immediately and within twenty-four (24) hours, any known reasonably believed instances of missing data, data that has been inappropriately shared, or data taken off site to my immediate supervisor, Associate Commissioner, and to the KDE Office for whom I perform work under the contract with KDE.

The contractor hereby agrees that the Commonwealth may withhold payment(s) owed to the contractor for any violation of the Identity Theft Prevention Reporting Requirements.

The contractor hereby agrees to undertake a prompt and reasonable investigation of any breach as required by KRS 61.933.

Upon conclusion of an investigation of a security breach of Personal Information as required by KRS 61.933, the contractor hereby agrees to an apportionment of the costs of the notification, investigation, and mitigation of the security breach.

In accordance with KRS 61.932(2)(a) the contractor shall implement, maintain, and update security and breach investigation procedures that are appropriate to the nature of the information disclosed, that are at least as stringent as the security and breach investigation procedures and practices established by the Commonwealth Office of Technology:

Student Data Security

Pursuant to KRS 365.734 (House Bill 232 (2014)), if contractor is a known cloud computing service provider (as defined in KRS 365.734(1)(b) as “any person or entity other than an educational institution that operates cloud computing services”), or, through service to agency, becomes the equivalent of a cloud computing service provider, contractor does further agree that:

Whereas, the first party, the state agency, has concluded that either state personnel are not available to perform said function, or it would not be feasible to utilize state personnel to perform said function; and **Whereas**, the second party, the Contractor, is available and qualified to perform such function; and **Whereas**, for the abovementioned reasons, the state agency desires to avail itself of the services of the second party;

NOW THEREFORE, the following terms and conditions are applicable to this contract:

1.00 Effective Date:

This contract is not effective until the Secretary of the Finance and Administration Cabinet or his authorized designee has approved the contract and until the contract has been submitted to the Legislative Research Commission, Government Contract Review Committee ("LRC"). However, in accordance with KRS 45A.700, contracts in aggregate amounts of \$10,000 or less are exempt from review by the committee and need only be filed with the committee within 30 days of their effective date for informational purposes.

KRS 45A.695(7) provides that payments on personal service contracts and memoranda of agreement shall not be authorized for services rendered after government contract review committee disapproval, unless the decision of the committee is overridden by the Secretary of the Finance and Administration Cabinet or agency head, if the agency has been granted delegation authority by the Secretary.

2.00 LRC Policies:

This section does not apply to governmental or quasi-governmental entities.
